





Late Ahmad Hassan Dani (20.07.1920-26.01.2009)

Prof. Ahmad Hassan Dani was born at Basna in Mahasamund district of Chhattisgarh, on 20th July 1920. He completed his early schooling at his own state. He completed his Master Degree in 1944 at B.H.U. in Uttar Pradesh.With his knowledge of Sanskrit Ahmad Hasan Dani became the first Muslim student of Banaras Hindu University where he broke the 25-year-old record of achieving the highest mark in MA (1944), becoming the first Muslim gold medallist in the University. Then he joined Taxila School of Archaeology in 1944 under the able guidance of Sir Mortimer Wheeler. During that time he was the Head of the Department of Social Science, Islamabad, India. In 1945 he joined the Department of Archaeology, Govt. of India and worked as Archaeologist with Sir Mortimer Wheeler and participated in the excavation works at Taxila and Mohenjodaro subsequently he was posted at the Taj Mahal at Agra of Central circle, of Archaelosical Survey of India.

After partition (1947), he moved to Dhaka and worked as Superintendent in the Department of Archaeology. At that time, he rectified the Varendra museum in Rajasahi. In 1950, he was promoted to the position of Superintendent in charge of Archaeology. From

1950 to 1962, he worked as Associate Professor of History at the University of Dhaka and also as Curator at Dhaka Museum. During this period, he carried out archaeological research on the Muslim History of Bengal. He also worked as a Research Fellow at the School of Oriental and African Studies, University of London (1958-59). He introduced archaeology as a discipline in higher education in Pakistan Bangladesh.

In 1962, he joined University of Peshawar as professor of Archaeology and remained there till 1971. He conducted a number of archaeological explorations and excavations on the Stone Age and Gandhara culture sites in the northern areas and guided the reorganization of Lahore and Peshawar Museums. For the first time he coined the Gandhara Grave culture.

In 1969, he became Asian fellow at the Australian National University, Canbera. In 1971, he came to Quaid-i-Azam University in Islamabad and established the faculty of Social Sciences where he served as its Dean. In 1974, he went to the University of Pennsylvannia in Philadelphia as a visiting scholar. In 1980, he retired from Quaid-i-Azam

University in Islambad.

From 1985, he was involved in research focusing on documentation of ancient rock-carvings and inscriptions on remains from the Neolithic age in the mountainous region of Gilgitbaltistan along with University of Heidelberg. In 1990-91, he held UNESCO's international scientific teams for Desert Route Expedition of Silk Road in China and steppe Route Expedition of the Silk Road in the former Soviet Union.

In 1993, he received an honorary doctorate from Tajikistan University in Dushanbe. In the same year, Prof. Dani established the Islambad museum and was its founding Director Between 1992 and 1996, he was appointed adviser on Archaeology to the Ministry of Culture, Government of Pakistan. He established the Taxila Institute of Asian Civilization in 1997 where he was made honorary director.

Prof. A.H. Dani had been extensively engaged in excavation works on the pre-Indus Civilization site of Rehman Dheri in Northern Pakistan. He also made a number of discoveries of Gandhara sites in Peshawar and Swat Valley and worked on Indo-Greek sites in Dir. He had also worked on the Harappa and Mohen-jodaro archaeological projects.

Prof. Dani was awarded Gold Medal by Banaras Hindu University (1944), honorary fellowships of the Royal Asiatic Society of Bangladesh (1969), German Archaeological Institute (1981), Ismero, Rome (1986) and Royal Asiatic Society (1991). He also received Gold Medal by the Asiatic Society of Bangladesh (1986). He was also the recipient of various civil awards in Pakistan and abroad. The Government of Pakistan had awarded him Hilal-e-Imtiaz, in 2000 and Sitara-e-Imtiaz, in 1969, Pride of Performance and Aizaz-e-Kamal in recognition of his meritorious contributions. Besides, he bagged laurels from all over the world including the award of Legion d'honneur (1998) by the president of the French Republic, Aristotle Silver Medal (1997) by UNESCO, Order of the Merit (1996) by the Government of Germany, Knight Commander (1994) by the Government of Italy, Palmes Academiques (1990) by the Government of France.

He was fluent in Hindi, Marathi, Bangla, French, Kashmiri, Urdu and other languages. He had also published various texts in most of these languages. He was also the recipient of various civil awards in Pakistan and abroad. Prof. A.H. Dani published over 30 books and a large number of articles in various International journals. He also wrote Pre and Proto history of Eastern India. His latest book, The History of Pakistan, was published in 2008. His other books include Historic city of Taxila, History of Northern Areas, Romance of the Khyber Pass, New Light on central Asia and Central Asia Today etc. He Co-authored with J.P. Mohen, the volume III of History of Humanity, and with B.A. Litvinksy, the Kushano-Sassanian Kingdom. He also edited History of Humanity (From the third millennium to the Seventh

Century B.C).
Prof. A.H. Dani, the doyen of Archaeology, passed away on 26 January 2009 at the age of 89 years. He has left behind his wife, three sons, daughter, five grand children and two great grand children.




RAJYOTSAV-2010 (26th October-1st November)




31st October






